Beloved Yai Yai will be dearly missed

Angelika Cavleris— Jan. 18, 1917 - Aug. 24, 2010

Angelika Cavleris entered eternal life at her home on August 24, 2010 at the age of 92. Angelika was the mother of Soula and mother-in-law of Kenny Doelker of Palo Cedro.

Angelika was born on December 18, 1917 to Kristopher and Anastasia Karahalous in Kastri, Klinourias, Greece. She was their second oldest child. She had four sisters, Sophia, Katina, Alene and Matina and two brothers, Zahareus and Vaselis.

She was set up in an arranged marriage to Kosatodinos (Gus) Kavleris. Gus went to Greece and married Angelika. He brought her to the United States in March of 1957. They lived in Anderson, California where he had a shoemaker's shop. They welcomed their only child, Anastasia (Soula), on October 8, 1957.

Kosatodinos died in 1964, leaving Angelika to their raise their seven year old daughter by herself. Angelika decided to stay in the United States to give Soula a better life. Even though Angelika didn't know how to speak

English very well or have any work experience in the United States, she made it work with what she knew how to do. At 47, she started picking olives, worked in the strawberry fields and then got a job as a housekeeper at a convalescent hospital. She retired from there at age 65.

Her grandkids, Jeremy, Chris and Adam were her world. She moved into the home of Soula and Kenny in 1983 and helped to raise her grandkids. She was a very religious person, always had God in her heart and prayed every day. She sought to instill the value of the Lord in everyone set met. She was well known for making the proforo bread for communion at St. George's Greek Orthodox Church.

She loved to cook her Greek family recipes for her family. She gardened and grew her own fresh herbs. She always said that food didn't taste good unless you used fresh herbs.

She was known as "Yia Yia" to her grandsons and, "Mana" to her daughter and "Grandma" to everyone else.

A service was held at St. George's Greek Orthodox Church in Redding on August 28 officiated by Father Nectarios Rozadilla followed by a burial at Millville Cemetery.
